Dear Mr. Hallett,

With reference to your enquiry the other day, I have had a search made of our records, with a view to identifying the Arms on the silver urn and to ascertain if any pedigree and Arms are on record for the family of Saltus.

The engraving shows the armorial achievement of a married man. The Arms on the dexter half of the shield are those of a member of the Keane family, baronets, of co. Waterford, Ireland, which are gules three salmon naiant in pale argent; and the Crest, a Cat-a-mountain sejant proper holding in his dexter paw a banner of the Union of Great Britain. Those of his wife on the sinister side are either the arms of O'Kelly or O'Shaughnessy. The ground in the former is azure, but they have chains hanging down from the battlements, which are not shown in your drawing. *

No Arms or pedigree have been recorded at any time for any family of Saltus anywhere in England.

P.H. Reaney, The Dictionary of British Surnames, the standard work on the subject, does not record the surname Saltus in the British Isles. He may possibly have missed it, in which case it must be a very rare one. Do you happen to know what part of England the first Saltus came from?

Do the Governors of the Saltus Grammar School wish to apply for a Grant of Arms for the School? If so, I can give you particulars of the procedure.


Dear Sir,
