Dear Mr. Mead:

I met Mr. Boice at Tronze a short time ago. Yesterday - in my absence - he called at our place, told Mrs Teator he would like to have you come and see him - that "it is getting time for me to know - that if I do not sell I can go on with preparations for the year" "I want to sell." He also said - as he had told me previously - "There is a party from New York who is considering the farm - wanted to come to look at it before the snow storm (that is about the time you were here) - but I do not think he has had any later communication with the New York party. or how high he holds the place, if you can induce him to part with it for reasonable price within reason - and if you like the place sufficiently well, it looks to me that you can plan out a fine orchard, and the location is very desirable. For the rest - rather a large percentage of low ground - not worth as much in my estimation as orchard land - or upland if you will. That low ground can become a big timothy field - at some preliminary cost - or it will support a considerable dairy - just as you would choose - it will require work and study and cost either way. Enough of each to keep a pretty good man busy.

I do not know what I ought to say. While I should like exceedingly to have you start your life's work here near us - as did Mr. Bonnot I would not be the one to lead you into any disappointment. If the place suits you, and you can find it in your future, and you can buy it at a price that is not extravagant, it may be well.
