
















CLASS OF 1980




The parade caravan traveled through town back to the high school where the Ellenville Blue Devils and Red Hook Raiders battled it out on the football field.




VARSITY FOOTBALL '78 By Dale Magley




It's 8:05am, a bell rings and it's the first day of high school. We start a day filled with intimidating seniors, new classes, new teachers and a definite feeling of panic.

As the last note sounded into the crisp night air, we carried with us the Christmas spirit.






















BOY'S BASKETBALL 78-79 by Mike Baden






Wrestling


Golf

From the Editor: by Scott Traudt


