EZRA B COOKINGHAM

Ezra B. Cookingham had been president of the First National Bank of Red Hook for 10 years in 1960 and a board member since March of 1927 when his father, the late Theodore Cookingham was president of the board. He took his father's place as president in 1950.

LLOYD W HAPEMAN

Lloyd W. Hapeman was elected as a member of the board of directors of the First National Bank of Red Hook on January 12, 1960. He also served as Vice President of the bank at that time and had been associated with the bank since 1950. He was a graduate of Syracuse University and the Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University and served for two and one-half years in the China-Burma-India theater in World War II.

STANLEY LYNK

Stanley Lynk, who was Assistant Cashier in 1960, joined the bank in 1930. A graduate of Hudson High School he was a former resident of Livingston and for five years prior to his service with the Red Hook Bank was associated with the Farmers National Bank of Hudson.

DONALD E NORTON

Donald E Norton, director of the bank in 1960 was owner of the Red Hook Insurance agency. He was named director of the bank in 1953.

FRED COTTING

Fred Cotting, general bookkeeper of the bank in 1960 first started to work for the First National Bank of Red Hook on February 25, 1918 as a teller.

ALBERT F KERLEY

In 1960 Albert F. Kerley was the oldest employee in point of service with the First National Bank of Red Hook. He was the bank's cashier and also vice president of the Board of Directors. A native of Red Hook, Kerley was employed with the bank since 1904.
