Football Disappointing—But Building

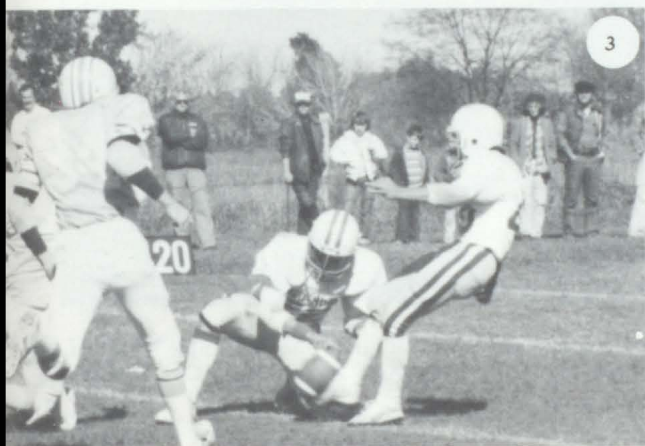

The Mid-Hudson Athletic League All-Star team included Debbie Rogers, First

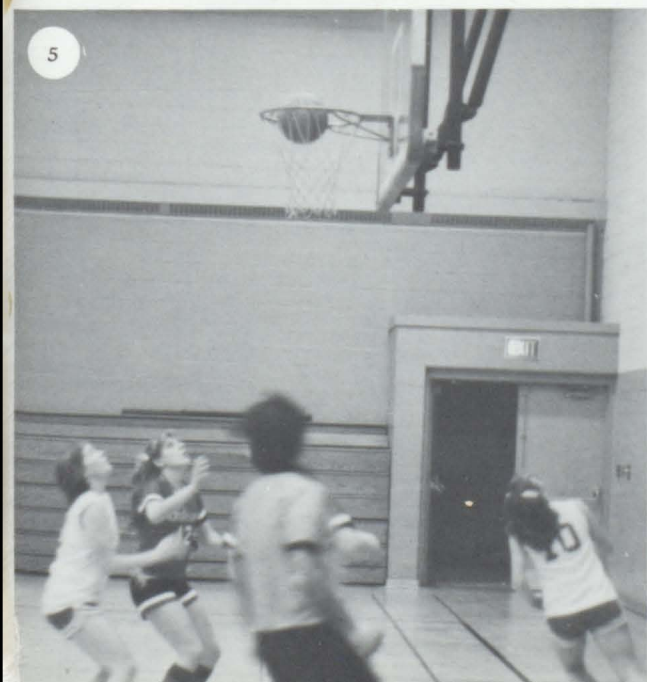
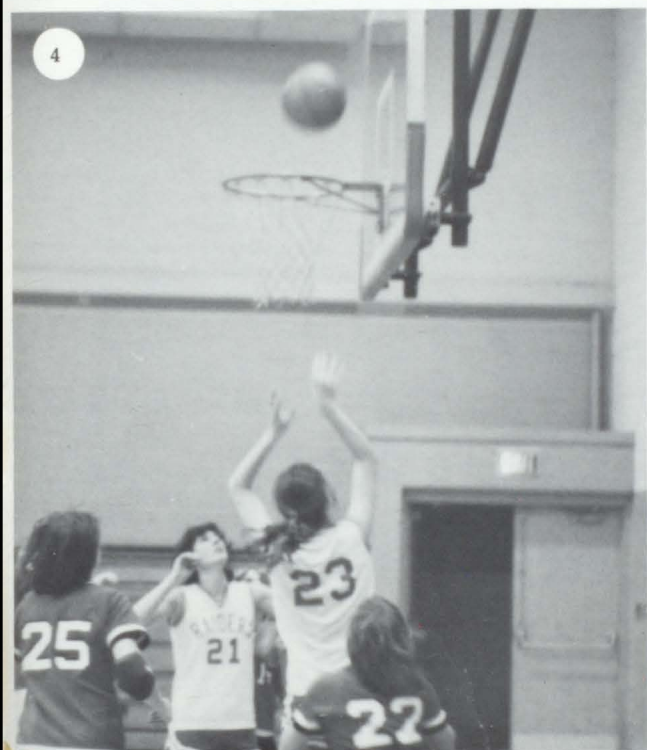
team, and Jackie Carroll and Lisa Shook, Second team. Debbie Rogers was also selected as a **KINGSTON FREEMAN** All-Star.

Combining with Rhinebeck this year turned out for the better. Everyone got along well, and had a good time together.

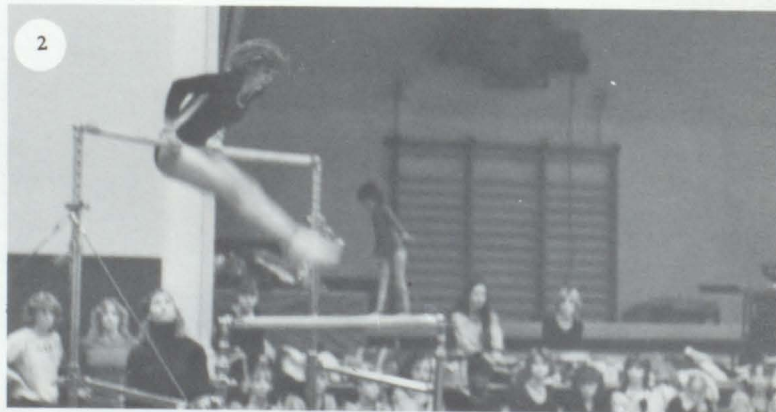

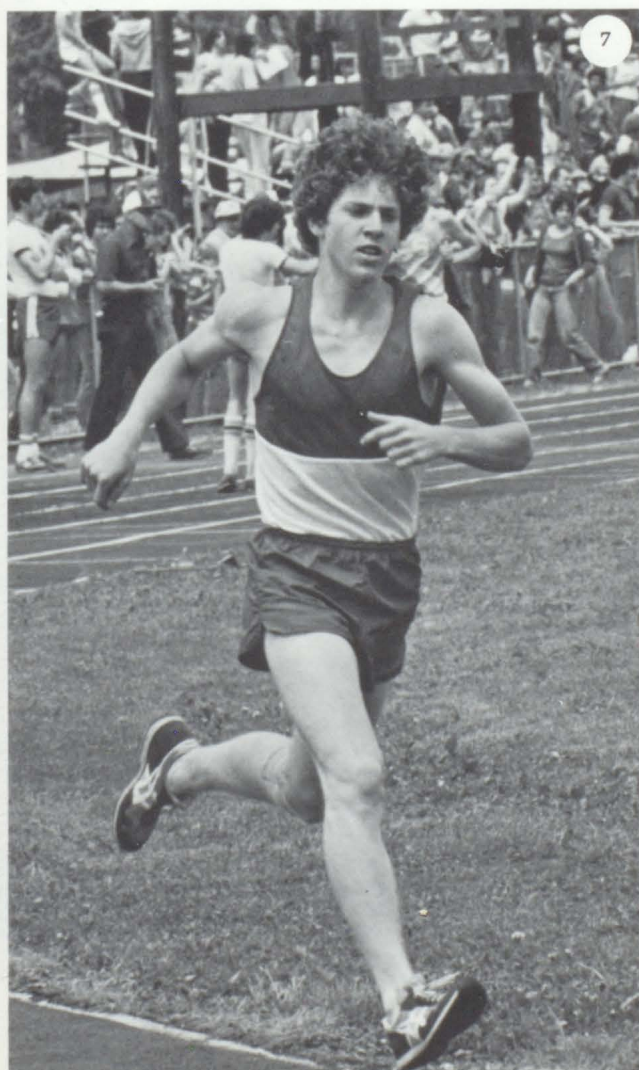
"Cruncher" Ward will prove as promising runners for Red Hook's future.

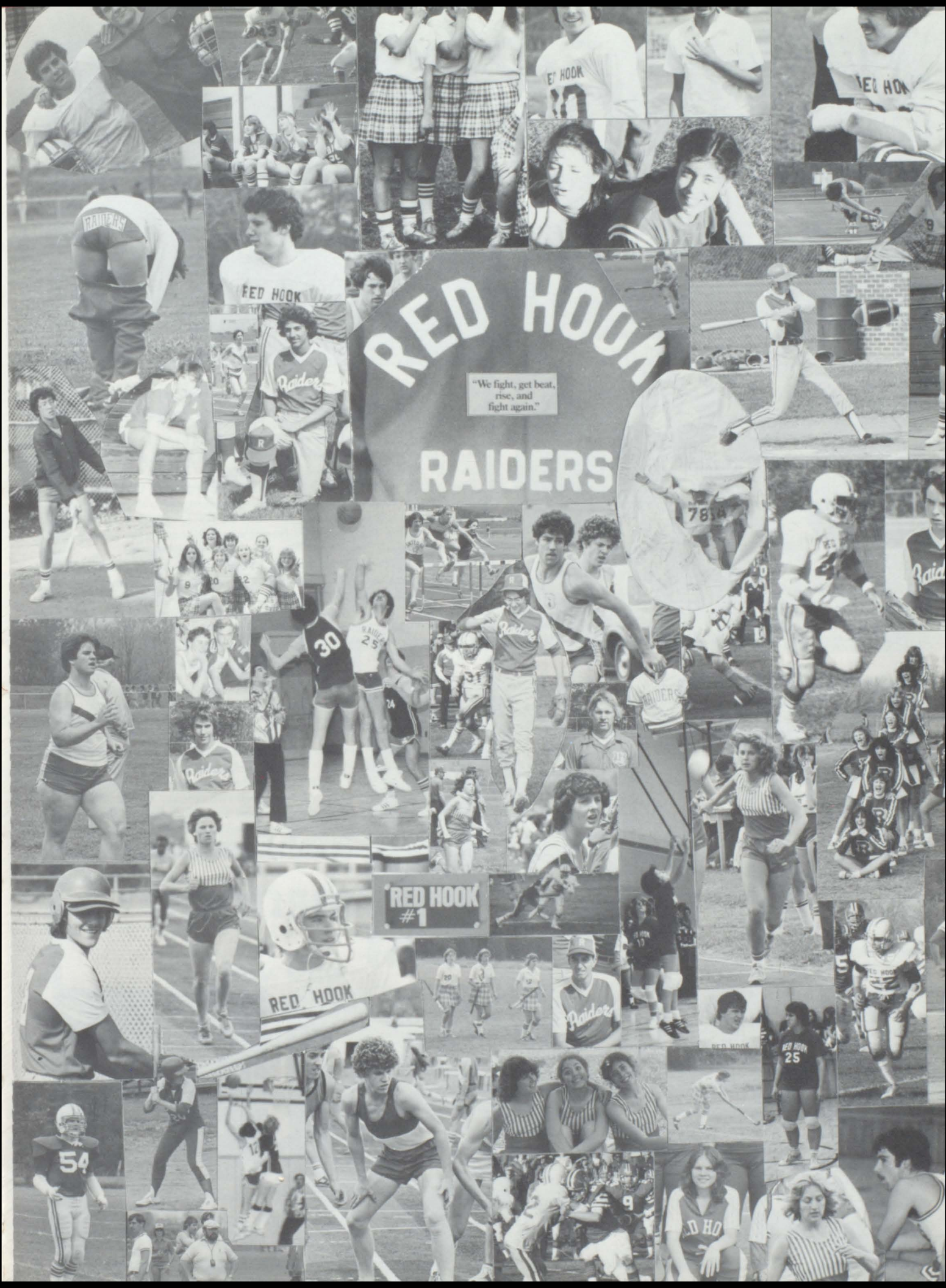
