Kelly, *St. Paul's Luth Ch of Red Hook, Dutchess Co, NY*, (transcripts), bapt 11.1.1861.), and died May 02, 1931 in Red Hook, Dutchess Co, NY.

Notes for JOHN NELSON HAPEMAN:

John Nelson Hapeman was always known as simply Nelson. He was a Corporal in the 7th Regiment of the New Jersey Infantry in the Civil War. He was wounded in the Seven Days Battle that was fought near Petersburg, VA. He was captured by the Rebels and interred in the Andersonville prison, from whence he eventually escaped. He walked back to NY and was then assigned to the 32nd Infantry, Company B, from which he was discharged. He received a pension.

Nelson Hapeman, my great grandfather, is buried in St. Paul's Cemetery in Red Hook beside his wife Catharine.

ref: "Decisive Battles of the Civil War" by Lt. Joseph B. Mitchell, copyright 1955, Seven Days Battle: Began June 25, 1862, east of Richmond, VA and north of the James River.

DAY 1: June 25th: Lee prepared for attack on McClellan's army, split by the Chickahoiny River - one corps on the north bank and other four on the south. Lee planned to attack the isolated corps of the Union, which was under the command of Brig. Gen. Fitz-John Porter, simultaneously in front and on the flank. Frontal attack to be made by Maj. Gen. A. P. Hill's Div. Stonewall Jackson to attack the flank.

DAY 2: June 26th: Stonewall Jackson was late. Hill after waiting until noon, attacked and was repulsed. Porter retired to a new position. Called "The Battle of Mechanicsville".

DAY 3: June 27th: Confederates again attacked Porter when they out-numbered 2 to 1. Troops under Hill, Jackson, aided later by Maj. Gen. James Longstreet, broke the Union lines, even though Porter received reinforcements. Union forces escaped under cover of darkness across the Chickshominy River. Called the "Battle of Gaines Mill."

DAY 4: June 28th: Very little combat. McClellan changed its supply line south to James River instead of base on the York River. Since supply line had been cut by Confederates in the previous day attack.

DAY 5: June 29th: Called the "Battle of Savage's Station." A rear guard action, in which the Confederates were repulsed.

DAY 6: June 30th: Another rear guard action near Glendale. Confederates again repulsed. Union forces retired during the night.

DAY 7: July 30th: Vattle fought at Malvern Hill. Union position was very strong. Lee ordered attack late in the afternoon. Confederate troops were severely repulsed.

The next day, the Union troops retreated to Harrison's Landing, in the James River plantation area and Lee shortly thereafter returned to Richmond.

RESULTS: Lee had maintained the offensive and managed to push the Union army to the southeast in a great curve, stretching from Mechanicville to Malvern Hill. The threat to Richmond vanished and morale was restored.

CASUALTIES: Union suffered almost 16,000 killed, wounded, captured or missing. Confederates lost approximately 20,000.

Notes for CATHARINE MATILDA HAWVER:

Catharine Hawver was the daughter of Jonas Hawver & Catharine Eliza Palmatier. Her mother was a widow when Catharine and her brother were baptized as older children in St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Red Hook. Catharine worked at the home (orphanage for girls) south of the village of Red Hook before she and Nelson Hapeman were married. Her mother had remarried and had a child by her 2nd husband, Jacob Straat.

Information on my great grandmother was given to me by my mother, her grand daughter and Aunt Allie Griffing, her daughter.

Catharine Hawver was very small and shapely. She was very blond and described as looking like a Dresden doll.

After Nelson died, Catharine lived with Aunt Allie Griffing until her death.

Catharine is buried with her husband Nelson in St. Paul's Cemetery, Red Hook, Dutchess Co, NY.

Notes for HAROLD LEE HAPEMAN:

Harold Lee Hapeman was always known as Harry Hapeman. He used to come to our house to visit with his wife. He loved children and I was always very fond of him. He resided in Red Hook in later life, where he worked at the corner store for Uncle Will Scism and then later for Cowhig's.

He married Mae Doherty, a Catholic (1881-1935). They resided in NYC where they had a child that they lost at a very young age and then were unable to have any more children. Mom used to visit them in the City.

Notes for HENRY EDWARD KIPP:

When Henry and Lillian Kipp were first married, they resided in Yonkers, NY, moving to the Town of Milan where they operated a leased farm on Brooklyn Heights, above Lake Sepasco. They later purchased a farm and large home (a former Robert Livingston home) west of Rock City, where Henry farmed the land with hired help and Lillie did much of the work of operating a summer boarding house, again with hired help. Henry was a mason as well as a farmer and after the death of Lillian and the marriage of my mother Rita, he sold his property to Mr. Jonas for the operation of Camp Rising Sun. He opened a store in Rock City and had his living quarters on the second floor above the store. He used to sell penny candy at the store and brought my sisters and me candy when he came to our house for dinner on Sundays and holidays. Grandpa Kipp always smoked a pipe and loved my mother's freshly baked pies, especially lemon meringue. He died of cancer of the liver.

Ray Kipp & his wife Ethel Thompson lived in Red Hook, moving to New Jersey. They lived in Jersey City area before purchasing a home in Teaneck. He was the director of the Drake Business Schools in Union City & Jersey City, Bergen Co, NJ. Ethel also worked part-time at the schools. Upon retirement, they moved to Concord, NH to be near their daughter Dot and her family. For a while they managed a mobile home park owned by their daughter and son-in-law. Harold (s-i-l) died suddenly shortly afterwards. Ray & Ethel stayed on, but eventually had to give up the management and move into their small retirement house in Concord. Ethel's mother, Mrs. Thompson, always lived with Ray and Ethel. She died in NH and is buried in Penacook. Her name and data is carved on a stone in the Thompson family plot in St. Paul's Cemetery of Red Hook, NY, but only her husband is actually buried there. Uncle Ray & Aunt Ethel's son Winn is buried in the Thompson plot in Red Hook.

I spent the week of V-J Day in Teaneck with them. Uncle Ray and I had gone to a show at Radio City Music Hall and thus we were at Times Square for the celebration in 1945 when the War with Japan ended; however it was with a sad note that all of the delightful weeks activities ended with the death of my cousin Winn, from wounds and injuries that he had received when his plane was shot down over Japan. He was at that time at the Castle Point VA Hospital in NY.

Ray Kipp was the President of the New Hampshire AARP. They travelled around the country to National Meetings. They belonged to and were extremely active in the New Hampshire State Historical Society, doing much volunteer work and research in the State Library in Concord.

Ray and Ethel came frequently to Red Hook and to my home. My children loved them. They were the type of people that could bridge any generation gap. They loved life and enjoyed it. It was with them that I first took my faltering steps into the world of genealogy.

They belonged to the Episcopal Church in Concord, where they attended regularly. They are buried in the

cemetery in Penacook.

Aunt Edyth and George moved frequently as he went from job to job. They lived in Yonkers, NY when they were first married, moving to Pittsfield, MA before the birth of Malcolm. From there they moved back to Red Hook and then to Poughkeepsie, NY. They returned briefly to Pittsfield and then moved to West Swanzey, NH. George had suffered problems since serving in World War 1, where he had been gased. He died in 1938 in a VA Hospital, leaving Edyth with a 14 and a 12 yr old. She worked in the local woolen mill.

In 1940 Edyth married 2nd, in the Catholic Church in West Swanzey, NH, Clarence Smith (b 12.22.1908). Despite the fact that Clary was 8 yrs Edyth's junior, he took care of she and her children, buying the house that she had rented and staying at her side until her death in 1989. Clary died in a Nursing Home in Keene, NH on 1.3.1999.

Gary and his 2nd wife and their son live in Keene. He had a daughter Jennifer, by his 1st marriage, which ended in divorce. Jennifer lived with her grand parents in Vermont. Her mother's location was unknown. Jennifer, who had just started college, was killed when she fell from a cliff overlooking a waterfall. She was 18.

Terry ran away and eloped while still in high school. They returned and finished school and then left for Boston where they both attended college. Before the end of their college days, the marriage ended in

divorce—too young! There were no children. Terry has never remarried. He has spent his time devoting himself to his career. He worked for Ann Fogarty, the fashion designer, in NYC and eventually moved on to Chicago, where he did buying for Sears. He moved to Milwaukee and is currently working for a major high profile department store buying and living in Hong Kong.
