"WHAT ARE THEY DOING WITH THAT OLD BUILDING?"

Perhaps you have asked yourself this question as you passed by the Elmendorph on Route 9 in the Village of Red Hook.

The Friends of Elmendorph, Inc., an enthusiastic not-for-profit group, dedicated to the preservation of the Inn, would like to answer this and other questions you may have.

"WHY HAVE THESE PEOPLE GIVEN SO MUCH TIME AND ENERGY TO A PLAIN OLD BUILDING?"

The Elmendorph is the oldest surviving structure in the Village of Red Hook (ca 1750-1760). It is a rare example of a simple early Hudson Valley home that served as a stagecoach stop and tavern on the Albany Post Road — the important connection between New York and Albany. It was the community center of its day — a place for Town Board Meetings, courts of law, the site of the FIRST Dutchess and Columbia County Agricultural Fair (1817) and the first area Kindergarten. Wide floor boards, huge beams, elaborately carved Federal mantles, early panelling, crown molding and six fireplaces are among its architectural treasures. It's history and architecture have placed it on the New York State and NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES!

"WHAT HAS ALREADY BEEN DONE?"

Since purchasing the building in 1977, the Friends have replaced the building sills, rebuilt the foundation walls and replaced first floor framing where necessary. The building is now stabilized.

During the last few months, a flurry of activity has resulted in a new look for the old inn. The shingles have been removed, exposing the old siding. The Victorianera porches have come off, to be used on another restoration project in New York State.

"WHAT'S NEXT?"

This fall, the Friends will begin restoration of the west (front) facade, replacing the first floor windows and restoring those on the second floor. The doors will also be restored and new siding will be replaced where necessary. New gutters and leaders will be installed and the building will be PAINTED!

"HOW WILL THE ELMENDORPH BE USED IN THE FUTURE?"

The recent Folk Arts & Crafts Festival gave a taste of things to come. The Friends want the Inn to be used again to serve the community. A crafts center, meeting place for area groups, historical society headquarters, village historian's office, a Chamber of Commerce tourist information center, and perhaps, even a tea room, are among many potential uses for this wonderful old building.

"HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?"

WE WANT YOU to become part of the excitement of the preservation of this Hudson Valley landmark. By joining the Friends of Elmendorph, you will join your neighbors in showing that you CARE about saving an old Inn that was once an important part of this area's roots.
