Biographical/Historical Note

This accession was a gift from J. Winthrop Aldrich.

The "Pynes," originally known as "Green Hill," is a Livingston family home located in Tivoli, NY. The property originally past down thru the Livingston female line since ca. 1761. The current house was built by John Reade, husband of Catherine Livingston, in 1790 and continued in the Livingston family until 1904. John Swift Livingston acquired the property in 1815 and renamed the house to "The Pynes." The material contained in this accession is mostly from the estate of John Swift Livingston (1785-1867) who occupied The Pynes until his death in 1867 at the age of 82 years. John was married to Anna Thompson (1786-1838) and had four children
