

Allan B. Hendricks is The Oldest Living Depositor of the Bank

**Mr. Hendricks Was Also An Assistant Cashier, Serving
the Bank from 1904 to 1918—Is One of Red
Hook's Active Business Men Today at
the Age of 87 Years.**

Allan B. Hendricks, the oldest living depositor and assistant Cashier of the First National Bank from 1904 to 1918, was born in Red Hook, the son of Jeremiah Hendricks. As a young man he was engaged in the freighting business under the firm name of Allan B. Hendricks & Co., Barrytown. At one time he conducted the Red Hook Mill. Later in life he was actively associated with the affairs of the Bank, being assistant Cashier from 1904 to 1918. He has for over fifty years been a representative of several insurance companies and continues in active business at the the age of 87 years.

Mr. Hendricks' activities and interest in behalf of the bank span the whole life of the institution. He may well say with a famous statesman of history: "All of which I have seen and a part of which I have been." Few men have been accorded the privilege of so long and so intimate a connection with any institution as Mr. Hendricks has enjoyed.
