FOREWORD

WITH this issue "Hardscrabble" enters upon its second decade of existence. It was started by the class of 1940, the first class to spend a year in the new school.

During the days in Hoffman Inn, there were three senior annuals issued by the classes of '37, '38, and '39. These were mimeographed books, with the pictures pasted in place. Members of these classes will well remember what a task that was, but nevertheless they were proud of their results.


With the move into a fine new school building, the class of '40 felt that it should produce a better yearbook, and thereby established a precedent which has been carried on by each succeeding class. As has been explained several times, the name "Hardscrabble" was chosen because it belonged traditionally and exclusively to Red Hook.

To class of '40 belongs also the credit of starting the tradition of Moving-Up Day. Red Hook was the first high school in this area to celebrate Moving-Up Day, but now many other schools in the county have followed suit.

The first ten years in the new school have seen much progress in many different fields. In size, we have expanded from approximately 500 students to 700, from 29 faculty members in 1939-40 to 40 in 1949-50. We now have two fulltime music instructors, two teachers in the commercial department, six teachers in junior high school instead of two. Student Council has become an active and important part of our school life, growing out of the "Board of Control." The school magazine, "Ditto," has developed from the former "Blotter," and has improved to such an extent that this year it won the "All New York State" award.

What of the next ten years? Some of the lines along which we hope to progress and expand are: a course in driving, more adult education classes, an addition to the school building, providing an auditorium, more classroom, office and storage space, a second kindergarten, greater opportunity for drama and music. As the school grows and progresses, it is our hope that "Hardscrabble," too, will become bigger and better with each year of its existence. Long may it continue!


