
### Secondary Principal's Message

To change the format of the dance, we held a buffet in the cateteria before. Much hard work was put in by both students and advisors to make our dance the success that it was. Work began on the yearbook and Karen Kowalski was selected as Editor. Marion Grieg was selected as DITTO Editor.

The yearbook, class trip and especially graduation seem to be the prime events on our minds this year. The yearbook staff is compiling a fantastic yearbook, filled with new ideas and innovations. The selling of refreshments at two football games increased our treasury. Bull-Angus performed at our dance and we made a profit of \$650. Several guys gained recognition in football being named to the All-Star Team.

The girls showed that their strong points were in hickey, basketball, and gymnastics.

Besides enriching our athletic abilities, many of us got involved in seeking admission to colleges to enrich our cultural knowledge.

We leave this school now, to seek our fame and fortune as individuals striving for recognition.



































## We, the Class
