LOCKERS


Lockers play a very important part in our lives during high school. They reflect our own interests and personalities.



Hey! Does she mean me? I wasn't talking that loud, was I? I was just asking a simple question!


"SHHHHHHHHHHH!!!!"

In Brasil the school year goes from February to December and when it is cold here, as we take midterm exams, there, they are in vacation in the summer, with lots of beautiful beaches to go to.


But Brasil isn't only beautiful beaches. I hope you could know it some day. If it is going to happen, I'll be glad to welcome you, thanking all that you have done for me.



The Tension Builds As






"The History Of Most Of Our ..."
