


A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR:



Christian Social Concerns Commission

This Commission is basically concerned with answering the question "What is the outreach of the Church?" How does the Commission work to answer this question? By developing programs which present situations, problems and ideas dealing with three areas of general concern, ie; (1) Temperance-Health -Welfare, (2) Peace and World Order, (3) Human Relations-Economic Affairs.

The aim of these programs is to stimulate interest in and concern for these vital social problems among the members of our church as well as of our local Community. By focusing attention on local situations the hope is that church members and the community will think, discuss and act on problems with a resultant awareness of national and worldwide problems.

METHODIST MEN

The Methodist Men have the 4th Tuesday evening of the month set aside for their meetings. While the club has not been overly active on meetings, the men have been generous of their time when needed. The annual chicken barbecue in the fall is the club's one fund-raising function of the year, and the proceeds from it enable them to support the church through the building fund and by furnishing materials and labor for special improvements-such as the new stairway at the rear of the sanctuary. The men cook and serve the Easter morning breakfast after the sunrise service and serve the mother-daughter banquet for the women of the WSCS. Currently, some redecorating is being scheduled in the parsonage. Albert Hejnal has been elected to serve as president for the 1968-69 term of office.

BALL AND CHAIN CLUB

The Ball and Chain Club (alias the Couples' Club) was organized on strictly social basis back in 1959. Its one purpose is to give married couples a once-a-month evening together with no business or fund-raising problems to mar their pleasure. The officers are elected as couples, and each meeting is in charge of two couples who are responsible for entertainment. The only requirements for membership are that you be a married couple and that you like being with other couples for the sake of fun and friendship. Our presidents for 1968 are William and Anna May Smith. Your attendance is welcomed at our meetings which are usually on the 3rd Saturday of the month.




