### RESTORATION COMMITTEE

HE last hammer blow has been struck, the plaster painted and the restoration of the second floor gallery and north room is nearly complete awaiting only some volunteer hours painting trim and scrubbing the old board floors in the gallery. The project was begun by volunteers who removed the deteriorated plaster ceilings and insulated the attic floor above the north room.

Volunteers clean and polish the sales items for the Elmendorph Etc. thrift shop and the occasional yard sales which provide the basic financial underpinning for the restoration and maintenance of our historic Inn. In addition, all of you who donate saleable items to the shop and send checks for our fund drives have fueled the slow but steady progress toward complete restoration and utilization of our historic Inn.

Early in June, volunteers made it possible for eight fourth grade classes from the Mill Road School to tour the Elmendorph Inn, including a peek at the Historical Society's temporary archive room where volunteer Bobbie Thompson was hard at work completing the index to the thousands of items in the Losee collection of historic documents and photographs. An encouraging number of students expressed interest in using the Society's new historical archive center to learn more about the history of Red Hook and the families who helped it grow.

In truth, volunteers are the life blood which energizes the restoration, preservation and presentation of Red Hook's history. As the Friends of Elmendorph and the Historical Society begin to merge their efforts and expand their service to the community there will be many exciting new opportunities to learn about Red Hook and Hudson Valley history while supporting our joint volunteer programs. Watch for news in September about how a few hours a month can make you an active participant in preserving Red Hook's past for the benefit of the future.
