





up in the future.



We never could have gone that far without the great coaching of Ms. P. Bowman (P B), who gave us all and much more. Not only did we become a great team, but


great friends as well.














F.B. Cheerleaders




Girl's Varsity

Congratulations go to all the players on a fine year and special congratulations go to the departing seniors and to Coaches Pete McMahon and Rod Chando.











Gymnastics



With the many returning lettermen plus the addition of rising stars such as Randy Clifford. this year's tennis should be a race for the UCAL title.









freely.













"A yearbook should be full of pictures"... "The yearbook belongs to the senior class"...


A yearbook should not become a yearly chore done year after year without thinking. It is not put together by a bunch of "select seniors" who only do what they or the advisor wants.
