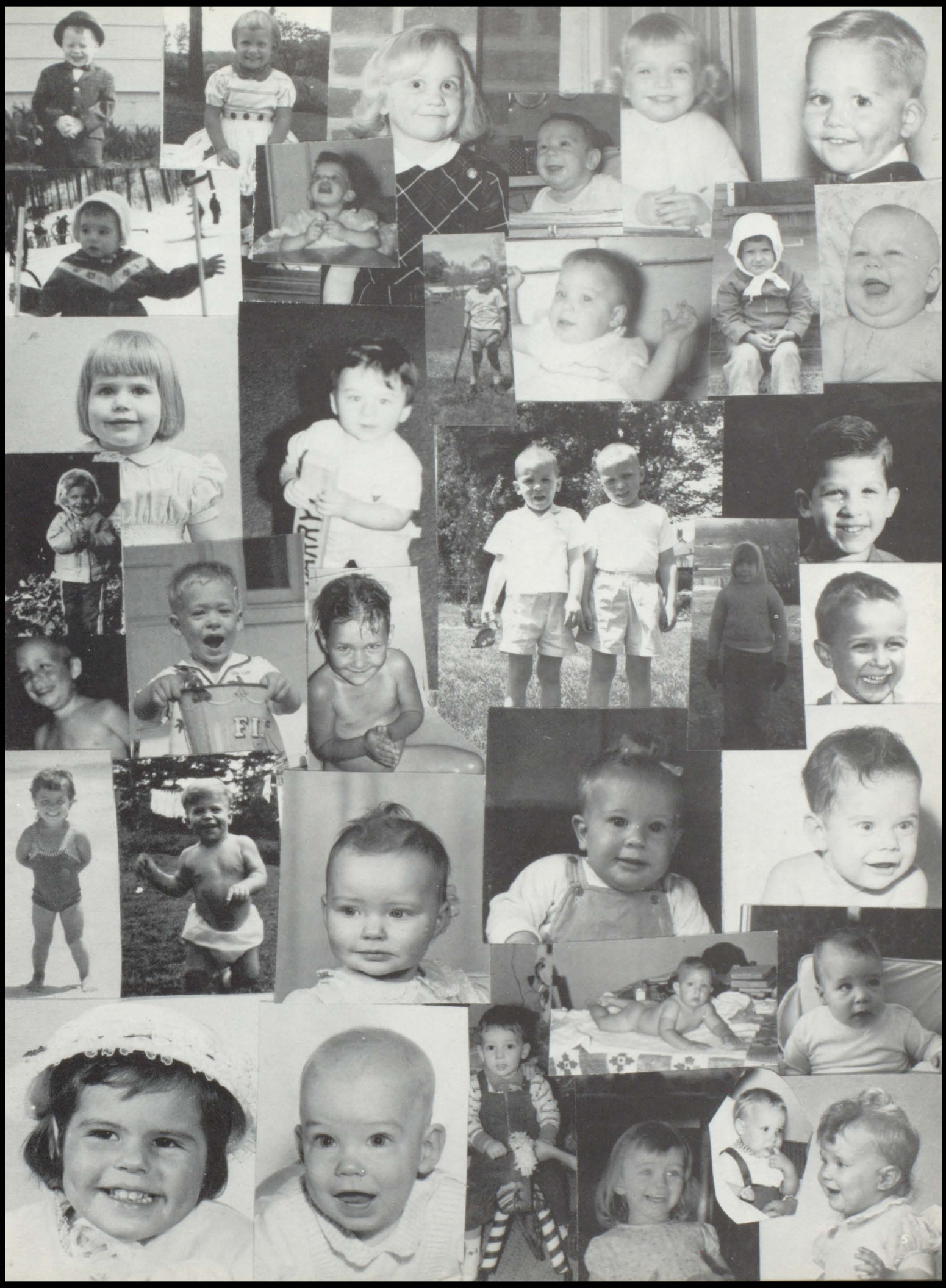

ing a helping hand and encouragement, trying to give ideas but at the same time wanting us to make the decision.


Now, as we are leaving Red Hook and our friends, leaving many years of memories, we want to give our thanks to our parents. Our parents shared these years.

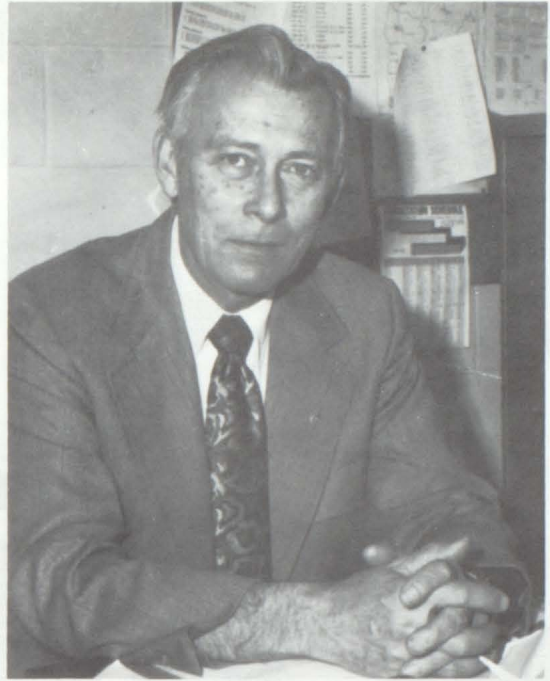
Evaluation of an educational program is a very difficult process and is subject to many degrees of interpretation.

SENIOR PLAY



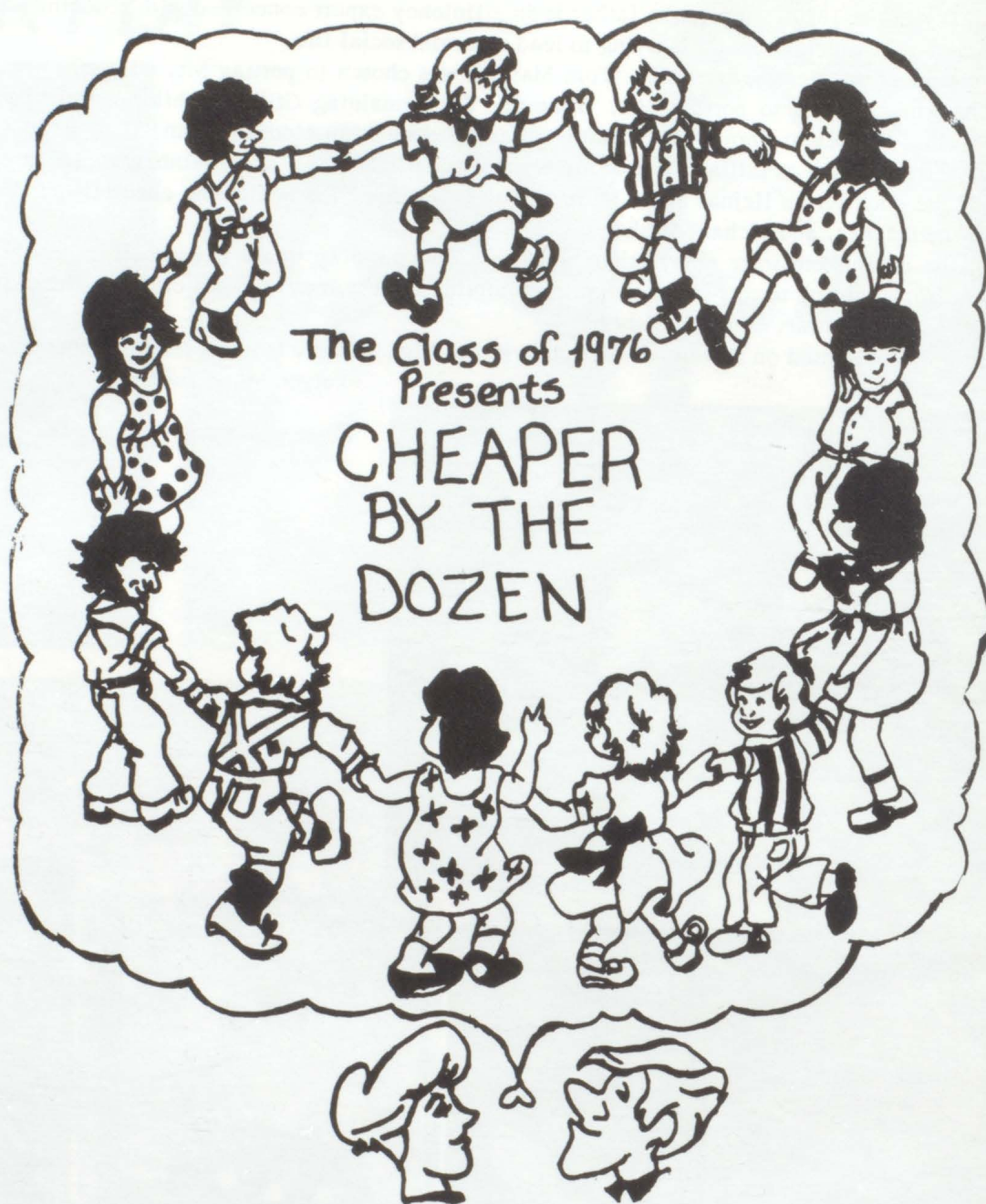
