

Legend of Resources

-HRH 1: Original sites taken from 1987 survey of Red Hook village. Homes selected for architectural significance.

-’75: 1975 survey of Red Hook conducted by Cornell students.

-RHHG: Red Hook Historical Guide, a walking guide of Red Hook Village originally published by the Bicentennial Committee in 1976, with later editions in 1977 and 1980.

-RHHWT: Red Hook Historical Walking Tour, a more complete walking tour of the village, meant to update the Red Hook Historical Guide. It was published in July 1996 by local teachers Andrea Clark and Ann Donnelly with help from the Friends of Elmendorph and a grant from the Mid-Hudson Teacher Center.

-RHWG: Red Hook Walking Guide, the most recent walking tour of the village, published by the Egbert Benson Historical Society in 2000?. Includes tours of Red Hook and Tivoli.

-Bassett: Reminiscences of Red Hook (A story of the Village) by Edmund Bassett, a first-hand account of living in Red Hook in the late-1800’s. Originally published as weekly newspaper stories in 1926 in the Red Hook Advertiser, this collection was reprinted in June 1976 by the Red Hook-Tivoli Bicentennial Committee.
