Scope and Content

This accession contains only one box:

- A collection of three address books for Alvia and Frank Stickles to include some Cinderella portrait stamps.
- Three scrap books from the 1880's containing a wonderful collection of trade cards, greeting cards and calling cards.

- Three Farm ledgers from 1799 to 1904. Possibly from the farm of Alvia Stickles. He owned a farm on Linden Avenue (later Linden Acres Farm). Many of the names in the ledger are local and Upper Red Hook.

Biographical/Historical Note

Carrie Ellen Burger(Coon) was born June 4, 1910, in Red Hook, daughter of Alvin and Frederica Metzger Coon. Carrie was the owner of The Handy Shop in Red Hook. She was a lifelong member of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Red Hook, and also a member of the Chancellor Livingston DAR Chapter in Rhinebeck. Carrie belonged to the Eastern Star and the Egbert Benson Historical Society.

Carrie and her husband, Owen Burger, purchased the Alvah Stickles house on Fraleigh Street. Alvah Stickles at one time owned a farm on Linden Avenue. Alvah Stickles was the Supervisor of Red Hook for many years and also a real estate broker and a farmer. These materials were found in the Stickles home when purchased by the Burgers.
