




upon a time, there was a land divided. Eleven kingdoms ruled




















Champions of the Realm

FIELD HOCKEY



VOLLEYBALL


The 1984 Red Hook Volleyball Team put in a respectable bid for the Section IX title ending with an overall record of 13-6.


Coach Karl Knapp and assistant coach Mike Lee did a fine job bringing this team together.


