
Why Hardscrabble?







DEDICATION


An extra special thanks goes to Mrs. Amy Goldsmith and Mr. Richard Totman. Their experience guided our way to a professional production.

As music director for all of our musicals, he accompanies us, teaches us the music, and from his year of experience, makes suggestions on how we should stand, hold our hands, etc.


In his spare time at his home, he teaches amateur radio classes to anyone who wants to learn, and he entertains many with his professional magical and musical abilities.


It's the wealthiest experience I ever went through before. The Americans appear very friendly and full of life, with a pronounced sense of humor; they attach importance on the development of their human qualities.



It has been a year to remember, and we owe our thanks to Mr. Rockefeller, our advisor, for all his help in making our projects successful.



The pancake breakfast had a small attendance, but a thank you is extended to the team members who came.




BOCES




























... A December To Remember














A STAR IS BORN

Although the season had its up and downs, it was enjoyable and we hope to see football at Red Hook in the future.



































Field Hockey

















Volleyball





Boys Basketball






Girls Basketball

Gymnastics


This years gymnastics team shows real promise. Only one senior was lost last season and as a result the Raider gymnasts are seasoned and professional.






















Basketball Cheerleading




Baseball


