



Pinks Tavern, 61 East Market Street

RHWG: This clapboard, commercial building was operated as a saloon as early as the 1860s. It was expanded by J. Louis Daley and was run by Henry Pink as Pink's Tavern for many years (*Maynard Ham Says: Pink had a roller rink on the second floor, open to the public), then as A'Brial's Tavern in the 20th century. It became a vegetarian restaurant in the 1990s.

Bassett: The hotel building on the corner of East Market Street was formerly only a small building used as a saloon by Levi Pulver, James Daly, John Sheridan Stickle, Mr. Green, and last by J. Louis Daly who built the present building and used it as a hotel until he sold it to Henry D. Pink.
