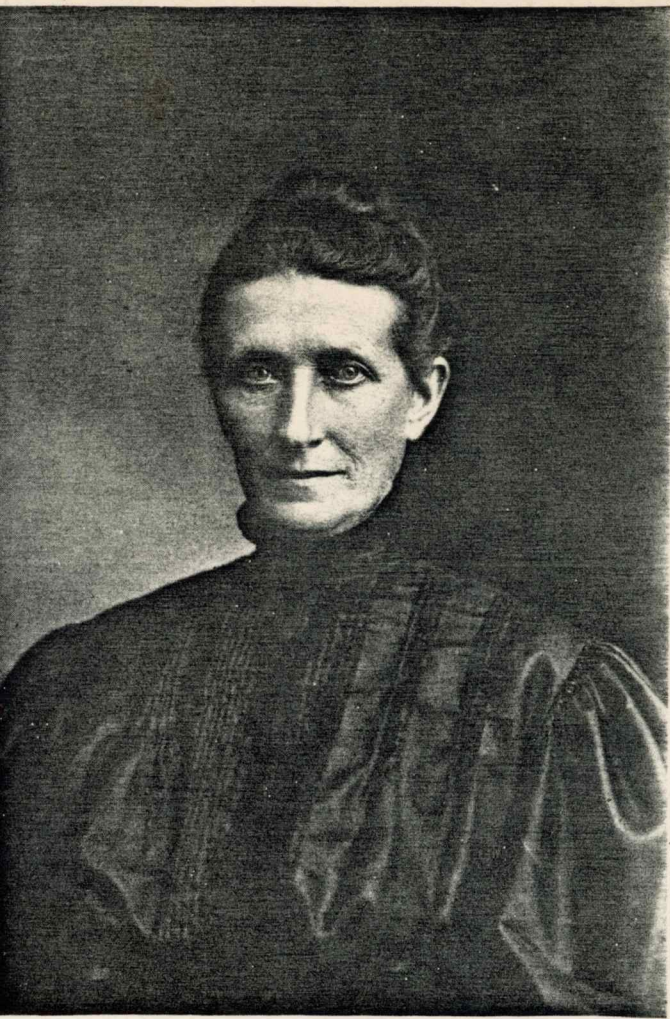

By his sterling qualities, his example and counsel he at all times exerted a beneficial influence on our membership.


We feel very deeply the abrupt ending of such a useful life. May his soul rest in peace!

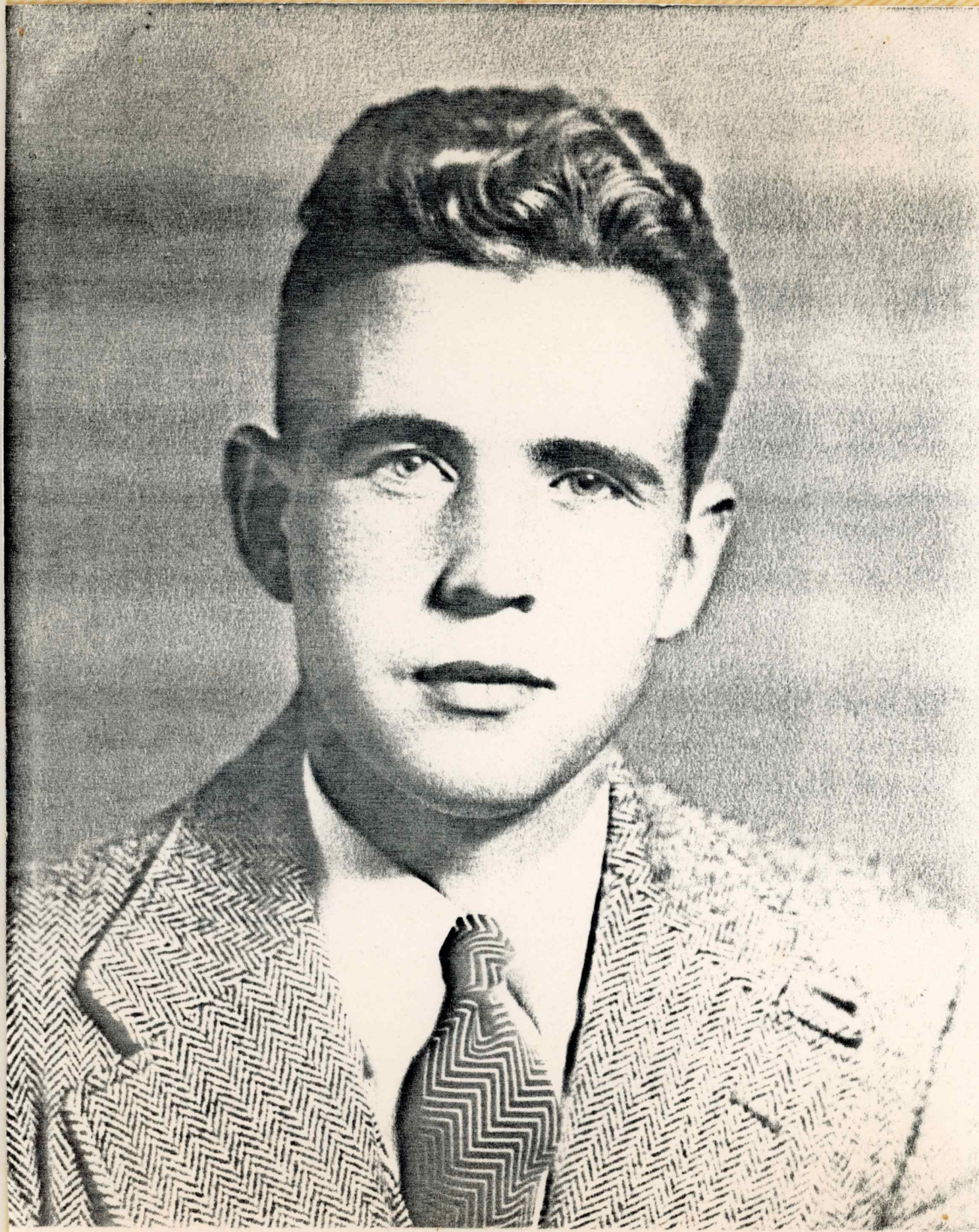

## North Carolina Girl Bride Of First Lieutenant Paul Hoch

Announcement is made of the marriage of Miss Sarah Locke Hardison, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Hammond Hardison, Raleigh, N. C., to First Lieutenant Paul Frederick Hoch, son of Mr. and Mrs. Otto Hoch, 17 Hoffman avenue, city. The ceremony was performed New Year's day in the Sacred Heart Cathedral at Raleigh. Monsignor Lennox Federal officiated.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, wore a gown of white slipper satin fashioned with a sweetheart neckline, long sleeves and a torso waistline. Her bouffant skirt extended into a long train and the full length veil of illusion was caught to a tiara of orange blossoms. She carried a cascade bouquet of bride's roses and white orchids, and her only ornament was a string of pearls, a gift of the bridegroom.
