

RESTORATION UPDATE

We have started!

The first stage of the restoration of the front facade has begun.

The electric service has been relocated to the north side of the building. With this move, two things have been accomplished. One, the existing antiquated service is off the front; and two, the service is now updated to present day standards. The service is underground thanks to our electrician, Robert T. McCarthy & Sons together with Bucky Coon and his backhoe. Bob, Scott and Bucky donated labor, materials, time and equipment. Many thanks to all three.

Archeology was performed prior to the digging of the trench by our Archeologist Cynthia Morrison. Results were transmitted to Albany and all seemed satisfied that we could proceed with the work. Cynthia donated her time for the project and we all thank her for a job well done.

While the trench was open, through the coordinated efforts of Bob, Scott, Harold Fell, the telephone company and Kingston Cable TV, phone and cable lines were placed in the trench. WE GOT IT ALL!

The plans and specifications for the front facade restoration were completed and an invitation to bid was sent to three selected bidders. Unfortunately, even after the Building Committee and Board of Directors voted a one month extension for the deadline, to allow one of the invitees extra time, only one bid was received. At a Board of Directors Meeting held October 3, 1983, that bid was

opened, and the Board voted to accept it. Work has commenced, and the time frame is still good for this phase of the restoration to be completed by winter.

All in all we are off to a fine start and would appreciate your continued financial support.
