Charles Eggert and his wife Betty purchased the VanNess mansion Maizeland (Maizefield) around 1963 and spent a number of years researching its history, restoring the building and listing it on the National Register of Historic Places. Charles photographed the restoration and also did photography of other historic buildings as well as landscape views for the Hudson River Valley Commission, located in Tarrytown, and other State and private projects. Charles and Betty are no longer alive. Their son, Christopher (Kip) Eggert, has presented the listed photographs and negatives to the Historical Society. Notebooks containing information and correspondence about Maizeland compiled by Betty Eggert and the subsequent owner, Sharon Hessney, had previously been donated to the Society by Mrs. Hessney. The notebooks include numerous photos of Maizeland taken by Charles Eggert.
