The suggestions outlined fit readily into the post war activities which many communities and industries are already engaged.

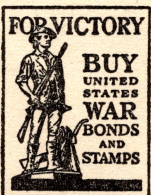
The pamphlet stresses a program of action which business men can promote in their own community right now:
