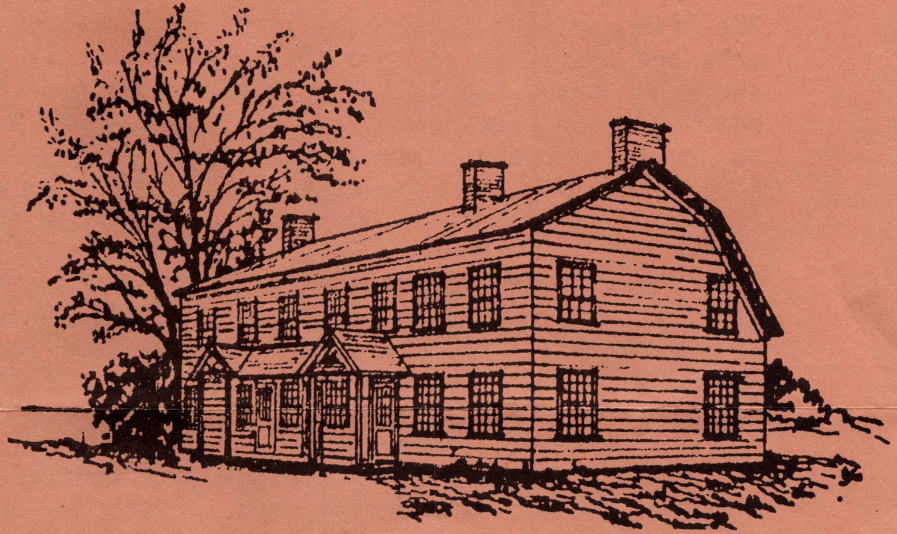

Can the Elmendorph Inn be restored to look like it did over 150 years ago? Apparently many of you thought so. With your support, our dream is beginning to become a reality. The front facade is just about complete. And what a beautiful piece of work.

During the past several months the front of the building has been insulated, several old window openings restored, and the second floor windows repaired. The old siding was removed. Siding that could be saved was scraped and given a primer coat, and new siding matching the old was put back up where it was necessary. At this writing most of the work is done except for the installation of the first floor windows and the two front doors, which are being reproduced. Special thanks to Mel Jones and his crew for doing the finished paint job.

TRADITIONAL ARTS & CRAFTS AT THE ELMENDORPH

The Friends of Elmendorph will sponsor a festival of traditional Hudson Valley arts and crafts in and around the Inn. Weavers, spinners, furniture makers, and other craftspeople will be on hand to fascinate and inform you with demonstrations and samples of their artistry. Musical entertainment will also be provided throughout the afternoon on Sunday, August 5. Special exhibits are planned for the Elmendorph, and the Red Hook Girl Scouts will be on hand to tempt you with refreshments made from 18th and 19th century recipes.

The Arts & Crafts Festival will be held on Saturday and Sunday, August 4 & 5, between 1 and 5 P.M. The program is being sponsored by the Friends of Elmendorph, with assistance from the Egbert Benson Historical Society of Greater Red Hook, and with public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts' Decentralization Program, which is administered by the Dutchess County Arts Council.

Photography and painting workshops will precede the festival. Beginning on July 7, these workshops will run for five consecutive Saturdays. They will be held at the Inn and at various locations in the Red Hook area. For more specifics, please refer to the flyer enclosed with your newsletter.
