- 1. The Rose Show will open on Wednesday, June 10th, at 1 P. M.
- 2. All exhibits must have been the bona fide property of the exhibitor for at least one month previous to the Show.
- 3. All exhibits should be marked "for competition," or "for exhibition," and with the number of the class for which they are entered.
- 4. All exhibits of plants must be in clean pots, with the exhibitor's number attached, provision for which will be made by the Secretary when entries are made. Cards will be given to each exhibitor at the exhibition tent.
- 5. All fruit should be shown on leaves and dishes with the names of the varieties attached.
- 6. All vegetables must be washed clean and si wn on plates, or tied in bunches, with the names of the varieties attached.

Fruit and vegetables must be ripe and edible in order to receive a prize.

7. No prize shall be awarded for exhibits not found worthy of the same by the Judges.

By a collection of Plants is meant: The greatest number of varieties of as many species as possible.

- 8. All exhibits of plants must be brought to the exhibition tent before 6 P. M. on Tuesday, June 9th.
- 9. Exhibits of cut flowers, fruit and vegetables, must be brought to the exhibition tent before 9 A. M., on Wednesday, June 10th.
- 10. Exhibits brought to the tent the day of the Show, not having been previously entered will be staged "for exhibition," but not "for competition."
- 11. Exhibits not classed on the premium list may receive certificates or prizes if found worthy.
- 12. Every care possible will be taken of the exhibits but no guarantee is given against injury.
- 13. No specimen shall be removed before Friday, June 12th, without permission of the Curator.
 - 14. Specimens for exhibition as well as for competition are requested.
- 15. Application for space should be made to the Secretary at the earliest convenience.
- 16. Entries for exhibits for competition must be made at least one week before the Rose Show.
 - 17. No competitor will be allowed in the tent while the exhibits are being judged.
