RHINEBECK - Irving A. Fraleigh, 80, Red Hook, died Thursday, Jan. 27, 2000 at the Northern Dutchess in Rhinebeck.

A lifetime Red Hook resident, he owned and operated the Fraleigh in Red Hook as did several generations of his family before him.

During World War II, he was an aircraft spotter for Civil Defense in the Hudson Valley.

Mr. Fraleigh was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Red Hook Alumni Association, the Red Hook Businessmen's Association, the Society for the Detection and Apprehension of Horse Thieves and the Farm Bureau.

Born in Poughkeepsie, March 22, 1919, he was the son of Irving P. and Mary Downing Fraleigh. Mr. Fraleigh graduated from the Red Hook High School in 1937. He attended Cornell University. On Dec. 26, 1943 at St. Peter's Church, Poughkeepsie. Mr. Fraleigh married Katherine Kay Hoch. Mrs. Fraleigh died Jan. 27, 1996.
