Dear Sir:-

Practically all lines of farm products in our various fields are showing either an increase in value or a firm selling position.

Eggs are of course leading the others with a rapid advance due to short receipts of fine quality goods. We need much more than we are getting to supply our demand and hope that you will forward us regularly your shipments. Our market is now 36¢ to 39¢ for finest to 32¢ to 35¢ for good, fresh white eggs, and brown eggs bring 30% to 34%. Duck eggs are also wanted at 33¢ to 36¢ for best fresh quality.

Calves are selling well and we look for a continued good market, which we believe will improve as cooler weather sets in. Prices are firm at 14d to 16d for fine white meated weal, weighing ninety to one hundred twenty pounds down to 8¢ to 10¢ for poorer quality veals.

While live poultry has had an off week this past seven days, we believe next week will see much better conditions prevail due to an increased demand for the Jowish Holidays.
