

These, the elected representatives of the voters of the Red Hook Central school district, hold all that Red Hook Central is within their hands. Theirs is the duty of preserving all that was good in the past, tempering it with the struggle for the present, and enriching it with dreams of the future.

The year we first entered kindergarten at Red Hook Central, 1953, is a long way back, and it is even a longer trip back to 1906 when the first class graduated from Red Hook High School. Sixty years have now passed since that first class graduated, and, from those first steps when the first class

graduated, our Alma Mater's story has been one of success.

However, success does not always progress smoothly, and when, on April 2, 1936, the Red Hook School was destroyed by fire, the loss was deeply felt. "On October 26, 1937, teachers and pupils, with banners and placards, marched to the Methodist Chapel where voters from eleven districts were to decide the fate of the proposed Red Hook Central School. When the votes were counted, 866 voted Yes; only 117, No. The new school board was elected the same evening and the work of the old Board of District Number Four for centralization was successfully completed." So it was that a larger and more permanent structure was erected. The building was dedicated in September of 1939 and, because of the tremendous increase in the student enrollment, an addition of seven rooms was made in 1953.

The ensuing years gave Red Hook its share of growing pains and, although the building was enlarged, we still felt the stress and strain of an ever increasing enrollment. In November of 1963, the present high school building was dedicated. In 1965 we witnessed the merger of the Tivoli Union Free school district with the Red Hook Central school district and the renovation of the Tivoli school to house the entire third grade of the Red Hook Central school district. In the fall of 1965 the voters of the district approved a proposition to build an elementary school building which will be called the Mill Road Elementary School. Upon completion of the new elementary school, the present elementary school will become a junior high school.


