


Organizing Board of Health

At a meeting of the officers of the
Town of Red Hook, County of Dutchess and State of New
York Composing the Board of Health for said town of
Red Hook and held at the office of the Supervisor
Madame this 10th day of April 1882, at 3 o'clock P. M.
The said board of Health was organized by the election
of Supervisor Frank, S. Ormster as Chairman, Justice
Wm. Donaldson, Justice Fred. H. Burnett, and Justice
Edgar L. Traver and Town Clerk John Hobbs was
present the same Composing a majority of the board
of Health for the town of Red Hook

Minutes of the Meeting

Justice Wm. Donaldson moved we
appoint Stephen R. Burnett of Red Hook Village a member
of the Board of Health, — Second & Carried

Justice Wm. Donaldson moved
that Thomas J. Baston M. D. be the Physician to the
Board of Health of the town of Red Hook, for the
ensuing year — Second & Carried

Justice Wm. Donaldson moved
that we appoint Mr Chairman Frank, S. Ormster
to write to the State Board of Health to procure blanks
and necessary information,

Ackerman Red Hook Village, Dutchess Co N.Y. this 20th day March 1883 for the purpose of organizing a board of Health for the said town of Red Hook.

Moved and Seconded that Dr John E. Lorce be appointed as Health Officer for the ensuing year carried.

Resolved that the annual Meeting of the Board of Health of the town of Red Hook shall be held on the third Tuesday of March at 12 o'clock P.M. of each year, carried.

Moved and Seconded that the town clerk of the Board of Health be authorized to procure necessary Stationery for the use of the board, with proper Books to record proceedings etc, carried.

Moved and Seconded, that the board of Health meet on the third Tuesday of June, Sept and Dec respectively, carried.

Resolved, That the Supervisor, Town Clerk, Justice of the Peace and Health Officer be authorized and empowered to grant Burial Permits upon the proper physicians certificates, and that each of said officer receive the sum of Twenty Five cents (25) for each permit so granted, Resolution adopted.

Resolved, That the fees of the Clerk of the board of Health be Twenty Five cents (25) for each and every record of Birth, Death or Marriage entered by him, Resolution adopted.

Resolved, That the health officer hereafter make and return to the Board of Health an itemized account for services rendered as such Health Officer, and that said bill be rendered to said board on or before Nov 1st of each year. Resolution adopted.
