Many dates are missing or incomplete.
Perhaps from the old newspapers which
you have been through from the Library,
you can give us some dates and facts.

32 E. Market St. owned by Jack Scheffler;
occupied by Murray Van Ness. (Inf. received -
before 1868).

36 E. Market St. owned by Josef Jozefowicz (very
little information given to interviewer).

42 E. Market St. owned by Richard Lawson
(before 1866)

44 E. Market St. owned by Paul Kochinka
(not much information - date - mid-1800's) 3 fam

50 E. Market St. owned by Don Norton, occupied
Marie Doyle (on corner - E. Market & Thompson Sts.) [before

62 E. Market St., owned by Robert F. Coons (next to Vinnie's Gas Station. Beautiful salt box, not original site. Very old, once was a tenant house on Thompson Farm.

51 West Market St., owned by Owen & Carrie Ellen Burger (oldest house on block) corner St. John & West Market St. - (during 1860's) N. Killmer
