Scope and Content

The collection consists of digital copies of family papers documents in the possession of Jim Hardin. Part 1 has indentures and other legal documents, 1739-1819 (Van Benthusen, Vredenburgh, Van Ness, Heermance, Elmendorph & Others). Part 2 has Estates, Wills, Misc Letters, Official Notices, 1828-1876 (Elmendorf, Wendell & others), Part 3 has Wills, Letters of Administration, and other documents, 1875-1899 (Elmendorf, Pitcher, Potts and others).

Biographical/Historical Note

James Hardin graduated from Red Hook Central School in 1958. He retired in 2004 from the Library of Congress where he was a writer-editor. Items were inherited from his mother, Mary Budd Hardin and uncle, Eugene Elmendorf Budd, who lived in the farmhouse at the corner of Linden Avenue (now Budds Corner Road) and Whalesback Road. That farm has been successively owned by the Elmendorfs, Budds, Hardins, Baxter and Steiner. The inheritance included items from their parents, Eugene P. and Mina Potts Budd, as well as their grandparents, Mary Jane Elmendorf and Peter F. Potts, who resided in a farmhouse on Pitcher Lane.
