

# Red Hook Bank Director Tells of Interesting Journey Thru Europe

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At Solicitation of a Number of Friends Has Written Journal of Voyage and Land Travel.

At midnight, on June 30th, 1925, Tour Seven of the Students' Travel Club, left New York harbour on the Cunard Liner Aquitania, one of the largest steamers in the trans-Atlantic trade, being 901 feet long, 97 feet wide, and with gross tonnage of 47,000 tons. Burning oil, we were not bothered by disagreeable smoke. The ship is capable of making twenty-three knots an hour and can carry five thousand persons on board. All of the state-rooms were filled. Mild weather was our good fortune, and the great ship was so steady that few of the passengers were sea sick.
