








As our class advisor in tenth grade, Mr. Sheehan introduced us to high school life. He helped make our famous towel sale a success and supported us in all our financial endeavors.






JAZZ ENSEMBLE





YEARBOOK STAFF


















might not have told him, his dedication will always be appreciated and remembered.

VARSITY





WRESTLING


