


MAIZELAND

Maizeland, the General Van Ness House, is one of a number of houses of historical significance built in Dutchess County from 1790-1815. The land on which both Red Hook Central School and Maizeland are located was part of the original Colonel Peter Schuyler Patent which was issued by the British governor, Thomas Dongan, on June 2, 1688.

Maizeland, the home of General Van Ness until 1815, has had several distinguished residents including Arthur Smith, Stephen Brinkerhoff, Tobias Teller, William Chamberlain, Mrs. Theodore Timpson and her son, Lawrence, Leon Shelley, and the Honorable Fred M. Dearing.

We at Red Hook Central have always felt that Maizeland was an integral part of our school campus. Each time we looked toward the mountains for inspiration, Maizeland was included in our view. We are sincerely grateful to the interest and generosity of Mr. Fred Dearing for making us the owners of this historical landmark.
