## HISTORICAL NOTE

This collection was compiled by Nancy Bendiner in 2021 and revised in 2024 to reflect the history of Red Hook garden clubs from their earliest appearance in the 1940's as the Red Hook Garden Club, followed by the Old Dutch Village Garden Club in the 1950's. Originally, the Monday Club at St. John's Reformed Church in Upper Red Hook was created as an educational club for female church members, then grew into the Historical Club. A number of members of the Historical Club decided to form a club about gardening in the 1940's. Eventually, some members and others formed the two garden clubs of Red Hook. The Old Dutch Village Garden Club is the only one currently active.

Especially in the earlier years, the garden clubs collaborated with Red Hook institutions and other area garden clubs to for example, raise funds and provide education to the public.

There is a substantial online collection of newspaper articles about the garden clubs in local newspapers, which can be accessed at fultonhistory.org and also through the HRH online site (especially see the Red Hook Advertiser).
