#### HISTORICAL NOTE

Gladys Fell (1927-2021) and Harold Fell (1924-2011) had a strong and enduring interest in the history of Red Hook, New York. This collection demonstrates that interest in various ways.

Ms. Fell collected newspaper clippings and memorabilia at least starting in the 1980's and included relevant material from much earlier as well. Both Fells were

interested in military history and he went to local cemeteries to identify and list military graves. Mr. Fell was instrumental in the acquisition of funding and the construction of the veteran memorial plaques now in the Veteran's Park at the Red Hook Village green, Mr. Fell was caretaker for the Richard Abrahams Memorial Park in his later years and Ms. Fell continued that tradition. He served as Red Hook mayor, village trustee, President of the Friends of the Elmendorph, and was a life member of the Red Hook Post 7765 VFW, where Ms. Fell was a member of the Ladies Auxiliary. Both Fells were members of a local rose society.

According to her family, Gladys Fell often placed flags on graves and memorials of military vets during holidays. She lived in her own home into her nineties and continued to show keen interest in her activities including watching over the Richard Abrahams Memorial Park, across the street from her home in Red Hook.

When it became apparent that the items in this collection could be donated to Historic Red Hook, the Fell family declined to fill out a deed of gift.

(Note regarding binders- there are many photographs within articles and placed in binders of buildings, people etc, including a small print photo of Hart boy riding reportedly the first bicycle sold in Red Hook)

This binder has protective pages usually containing articles, photos and miscellaneous items mostly related to Red Hook history. Most newspaper articles not dated but can often be identified as to timeline.

Subjects include: Red Hook Library, Gottlieb Martin House, Red Hook Hotel, Tobacco Factory, Red Hook Inn, Chocolate Factory (including large photocopy of group photo of employees circa 1910), Red Hook baseball and sports history, St. Margaret's Orphan Asylum, churches, First National Bank, Rokeby- includes article with interview of J Winthrop Aldrich (Red Hook Town Historian), Tivoli Library, Barrytown Post Office, Montgomery Place, Barrytown general history,

Articles with interviews of Rosemary Coons, Red Hook Village historian, and J. Winthrop Aldrich, Red Hook Town historian.

2006 Calendar that includes photo of 3rd and 4th grade, Red Hook school, 1928, and photo of men planting corn in South Meadow, Red Hook, 1916.

Miscellaneous items on: St. Margaret's Home- Architectural Tour, Part of chapter on Town of Red Hook from History of Dutchess County by James Smith

Extensive collection of obituaries of Red Hook residents in back of binders. Nearly all of these residents were veterans. Obituaries from various publications as well as funeral homes.

Letters between Mr. Fall and others, and communications regarding the establishment and building of the Veterans Memorial in Red Hook. Records of veterans names buried in cemeteries in particular St. Paul's Cemetery and cemeteries in Tivoli. Inclusive list of names of individuals buried in the Methodist Cemetery on Cherry St. Information, photos and maps of some small cemeteries including one where Fellers are buried.
