RHWG: Carnright House, 1855. This is an example of the large Victorian-style homes built in the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century when the town, like others in the Northeast, experienced some prosperity in business, freight, and manufacturing. Owner John Carnright was the captain of the barge Sarah Smith, a popular steamboat that hauled produce, meat, mail, and passengers between Barrytown, Tivoli, and New York City. He became partners with W.S. Curtis and Irving Fraleigh to form Carnright, Fraleigh Freight Co.
