Scope and Content

The collection includes photos and documents relating to Norman Vogel and Roland A'Brial.

1. Photo album. Created by Patsy Vogel about her maternal grandfather, Roland A' Brial.

Includes World War I photos and service certificates.

2. Book. 'History of the 77th Division' (called 'Statue of Liberty' mostly New Yorkers), to which Roland A'Brial belonged in World War I.

3. Scrapbook. News clippings from local papers collected by Norman Vogel. The first page is marked 'senior year 1934-35.' Norman was sports editor for the Red Hook high school newspaper. He didn't graduate because of an accident on his way home from basketball practice at the Bard gym where he was run over by a car.

4. Transcript of Red Hook commencement address by valedictorian Geraldine Van de Bogert '35 arguing for school centralization. Referenced in scrapbook.

5. Looseleaf notebook put together by Patsy Vogel with documents from the 1930s relating to Norman Vogel and a few items (business cards) belonging to his father, Henry Vogel. Documents include business cards, letters, menus, personal notes (many get-well signatures from fellow students), basketball songs and cheers, schedules, a lunch counter menu from the Notion Store (1934), and a Rock City Grange program (1935).
6. Norman Vogel's obituary.
7. Manuscript. Norman Vogel's reminiscences of his early years on the family farm on Yantz Road in Red Hook, 1920s and 30s. Includes stories about:
 - Farm life - apple farming, dairy, hay, raising chickens, stonewalls, fields, farm boarders, early lighting, telephone technology
 - Fraleigh School
 - Model T- and Model A Fords and gas stations (where he worked)
 - Red Hook village businessesOther people mentioned include Lou Dillman (Norman's cousin) and neighbors – farm next door was owned by Schultz, then Cookingham and then Ray Schoepflin (Norman's cousin).
8. School certificates belonging to Norman Vogel, 1928-1934.
9. Letter from Richard Battenfeld to Norman Vogel, July 10, 1932.
10. Text book "The News Outline" Feb, 1929-June 13, 1930 that belonged to Norman Vogel.

Biographical/Historical Note

Patsy Vogel grew up in Red Hook and Rhinebeck and has been very active in the history community. Her maternal grandfather was Roland A' Brial. (Nov 7, 1895 - Jan 21, 1969). He was Postmaster of Red Hook and served in WWI from 1917 until discharged in 1919. Patsy was married to Craig Vogel, whose father was Walter, older brother to Norman Vogel. Henry Vogel and his wife owned The Maples, a fruit, dairy and poultry farm in Red Hook on Yantz Road. Patsy and Craig were close to Norman Vogel.

Provenance

Norman Vogel's wife gave his papers to Patsy Vogel who in turn donated them to Historic Red Hook. Deed of gift in the file.
