History

of

Second Baptist Church

In the year 1988, was the first recorded date of the Second Baptist Church. Rev. Seymour was listed as Pastor. The founders in part were Rev. Charles Goner, Brother Nimrod Rainbow, Brother Nathan Ward, Brother Isiah Chinn and Brother L. J. Morris.

January 16, 1902, the church received their incorporation papers from the state of Ohio. The corporation papers stated the purpose of the church was for teaching of "religious truths and spread of the gospel among the members of the church and their families".

Our direct link to the founders of the church is through the children and grandchildren of Isiah Chinn.

In 1904, the church was moved from the north to south side of 12th Street where we worshipped for 53 years and the building remains today.


In 1904, Rev. Watson was the Pastor and also brought the name Francis into the history.

In 1905, Rev. B. K. Smith was the Pastor.



Rev. Boles set up Mt. Zion Baptist Church to care for members in the surrounding area, which is known as South Lorain.




