Lorain CORE Chapter Outlines 1969 Goals

THE CONGRESS of Racial Equality (CORE) has outlined its 1969 goals for Lorain, Benjamin Fain, Lorain president, said today.

The group also was critical of Black history courses that will begin next week in Lorain's two public high schools.

Fain said CORE's objectives for 1969 were:

-"TO INTENSIFY the development of Black Awareness amongst the socalled Negroid peoples.

-"TO RENDER assistance and guidance to those who wish to promote Black Culture activities.

-"TO SEEK change in the policy of the Lorain Journal which seems to make no distinction between the term Negro and Black.

-"TO POINT out the futility of local political involvement as the established order of things stand.
