Nancy Ann Arebalo Victim of Cancer

Nancy Ann Arebalo of 1843 E. 30th St. died of cancer Monday night in St. Joseph Hospital. It was her 24th birthday.

A bright and pretty young woman, Miss Arebalo had been employed as a secretary in the Display Advertising Department of The Journal for 4½ years.

MISS AREBALO had been ill for 18 months, first suffering from a stomach ulcer. Her death came after an exploratory operation Monday when it was discovered that she had cancer.

She belonged to St. John Roman Catholic Church where she taught religion classes for the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.

OBERLIN — Walter Carpenter, 62, of 339 W. College St., assistant superintendent of Oberlin Public Schools and clerk of the board of education, died yesterday at Allen Hospital of cancer.

A teacher for 34 years in Ohio schools, 28 of them in Oberlin, Carpenter taught mathematics and commercial subjects in the high school from 1935 to 1942. He left Oberlin to do accounting work, returning in 1950 to teach at the high school and later becoming principal of both Prospect Elementary and Pleasant Street Junior High Schools. He was appointed clerk and assistant superintendent of schools Aug. 1, 1960. He retired in April.

CARPENTER RECEIVED his bachelor's degree in education from Otterbein College and his master's from Columbia University.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Beta Sigma Fraternity and Oberlin Methodist Church. He was on the board of trustees and the building committee of the church and also was a past president of Oberlin Rotary Club.

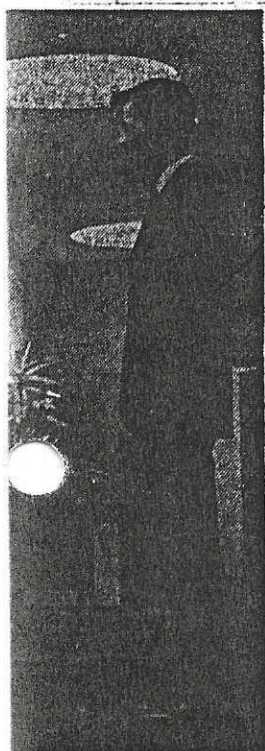
