Admirals shoot past Vermilion

VERMILION — The Admiral King Admirals play like a team searching for some respect from the state ranking system.

The Admirals went into Vermilion last night ready to play, and used quickness and quantity (72 field goal attempts) to ease past the much-improved Sailors, 71-47.

"During the flow of the game we were able to adjust rather well ... we just tried to get people to spot, move the ball and look for the opportunities," said King coach John Ralph.

The Admirals' adjustments became a matter of necessity as the Sailors came out of the gate willing to play King's style of up-tempo style. The strategy appeared to catch Admiral King off guard. They committed 14 first-half turnovers and were unable to shake the Sailors.

Vermilion managed to stay within reach and it appeared an-

other upset (the Sailors Midview last Friday) might have been possible. They went on an in the final 2 minutes of the half to pull within five at 38-35.

Prior to the game Sailors Mike Colatruccio felt his was "coming along and playing with some confidence." However, he was concerned matching up with a team that dubbed "probably the most talented in the conference."

That concern earned him merit in the second half as he came out firing. It took Gladden (17 points, 13 rebounds) just 15 seconds to find him and nail a 3-pointer. However, the Sailors maintained composure and traded baskets with the Admirals for the five minutes. That's when they turned on the power, leaving million gasping for air.
