

Gerald 'Jerry' Thomas Brown, 80, of Lorain, Ohio, passed away Monday, September 11, 2023, after a brief battle with cancer.

Jerry was born May 30, 1943 in Buffalo, New York. His family moved to Lorain when he was a teen and he attended and graduated from Lorain High School in 1961.

After graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served on active duty for six years as a Communications Technician (CTR2). He sailed on the USNS Private Jose F. Valdez across the equator and around South Africa earning his 'Shellback' before his tours in Japan and Winter Harbor, Maine.

After his service in the Navy, he worked at General Electric and Ford Motor Co., where he retired after 30 years.
