Name Meaning

Black Thomas Arthur Richard

English and Scottish: chiefly from Middle English blak(e) 'black' (Old English blæc, blaca), a nickname given from the earliest times to a swarthy or darkhaired man. However, Middle English blac also meant 'pale, wan', a reflex of Old English blāc 'pale, white' with a shortened vowel. Compare Blatch and Blick . With rare exceptions it is impossible to disambiguate these antithetical senses in Middle English

The G.I. Bill was a law that provided a range of benefits for returning World War II veterans that were on active duty during the war and weren't dishonorably discharged. The goal was to provide rewards for all World War II veterans. The act avoided life insurance policy payouts because of political distress caused after the end of World War I. But the Benefits that were included were: Dedicated payments of tuition and living expenses to attend high school, college or vocational/technical school, lowcost mortgages, low-interest loans to start a business, as well as one year of unemployment compensation. By the mid-1950s, around 7.8 million veterans used the G.I. Bill education benefits.

Scottish: in Gaelic-speaking areas this name was adopted as a translation of the epithet *dubh* 'dark, black-(haired)', or of various other names based on Gaelic *dubh* 'black', see Duff.

Americanized form (translation into English) of various European surnames directly or indirectly derived from the adjective meaning 'black, dark', for example German and Jewish Schwarz and Slavic surnames beginning with *Čern-*, *Chern-* (see Chern and Cherne), *Chorn-*, *Crn-* or *Czern-*.
