## **James Tomazic Obituary**

Wednesday, December 13, 2023. Jim was born in Lorain on July 30, 1943. He attended primary school at Ss. Cyril & Methodius Catholic Church School. He went on to graduate from Lorain High School with the 1961-B class and earned admittance into the Lorain Sports Hall of Fame (2013) as a lineman with the 1959 Lorain High Football Team. Jim volunteered to serve in the United States Marine Corps where he worked as a Radar Technician with duty in the Pacific and Caribbean. He attained the rank of corporal (E4), earned a First Award Sharpshooter's Badge, and received the Good Conduct Medal. 
