

Shephard, a member and minister at Cathedral of
Praise Church. Currently reaching the end on one career, the ambitious Ms.
Shephard has already made preparations to begin another.
Born in Hughes, Ar-

kansas, Ms. Shephard has long made her home in Lorain. A graduate of Erma Lee Beauty College in Cleveland, OH, she opened her first shop in 1970 on Long Avenue. As a divorced mother of two children living on welfare, owning her own business seemed impossible. With the Lord's guidance and help, her dream came true by divine intervention. The Lord not only provided the location of her business, but the financial backing she needed to set up and operate her first salon. She later left Lorain but after operating for a number of years in Elyria, Ms. Shephard again returned to Lorain and became the owner operator of Vera's Beauty Salon at 1855 Oberlin Avenue, a shop renowned for its service and styling know-how.

Expanding her business horizons, she became Senior Manager of her own nutritional products distribution network, featuring GNLD. Ms. Shephard believes that God's desire is that "...thou may prosper and be in good health even as thou soul prosperth." She has presented health workshops at churches, business gatherings, and the Ireland Cancer Center.

Ms. Shephard serves as President of the Pastor's Wife's Aide Committee at her church.
