in the Rail Road track between Flatbush
and Claver Avenue; that I read the same, before
the Directors of the Bridgetown and Jamaica Rail
Road Company agreeably to my promise, soon
after the receipt of your letter on the subject; and
was by them, appointed to confer with the Long
Island Rail Road Company in reference to the
proposed alteration. I communicated the fact to
the President of the Board, and a Committee I
understood, was raised for that purpose. Since
that, I have heard nothing from them. I will
however immediately inform the President of the
Long Island Rail Road Company of the renewed
