Mrs. Maude E. Callen, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Harrison Daniels, was born in Quincy, Florida. Following the deaths of her parents, she was raised by an uncle and aunt, the late Dr. and Mrs. William John Gunn.

She was educated at St. Michaels and All Angels Parochial School in Tallahassee, Florida and is a graduate of Florida A. & M. College. She received her nurses training from the Georgia Infirmary in Savannah, Georgia.

In 1921, she married the late William Dewer Callen. Two years later, they settled in Pineville, S.C., where she worked as a missionary nurse.

For many years, she served the people of Berkeley County as a nurse-midwife and worked with the Berkeley County Health Department.

As part of her dedication to the community, Miss Maude had a clinic built in Pineville, using donations she received as a result of the December 3, 1951, "Life" magazine article on her noble efforts. The clinic is named in her honor.

She is now the volunteer manager of the Pineville Nutrition site.

She has one son, Sinclair Richard Callen of Denmark, S.C.; four grandchildren; one great-grandchild; seven great nieces and nephews; and one great-grandniece.

She is a member of the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer, Pineville, S.C., and of Alpha Gamma Chi Sorority.
